Chief of Police Horrall yesterday served notice that burglary is going to be an unhealthy occupation hereabouts from now on

Concerned over the 18.8 per cent increase in 1945 burglaries, which totaled 12,866 for the year, the chief ordered a special educational campaign set in motion

to cut down the burglary toll. Officers, he said, will vis visit schools to warn students of carelessness that breeds burglaries —such as leaving doors unas locked, telling strangers they are staying with relatives while the folks are away, etc. Parents will be advised of "burglar-proofing" methods through newspapers and the radio.

The property loss here last ear through burglaries was vear \$2,419,853-an increase of 40 per cent over 1944.
