

westerly from the southeasterly corner of said Lot E, said point being also in the southerly line of Section 19, Township 1 South, Range 12 West, San Bernardino Base and Meridian; thence southerly to a point distant two hundred (200) feet measured at right angles from the southerly line of said Section 19; thence westerly parallel with the southerly line of said Section 19 and the southerly line of Section 24, Township 1 South, Range 13 West, San Bernardino Base and Meridian, to a point in the easterly boundary line of the City of Los Angeles; thence in the general northerly, easterly, southerly and easterly directions, following the various courses of the boundary line of the City of Los Angeles, to the point of beginning.

OCCIDENTAL ANNEXATION

By an election held in the proposed addition on November 18, 1915, and an election within the City of Los Angeles, on June 6, 1916, a record of same being filed with the Secretary of State, June 14, 1916, the following described territory, known as "Occidental", was annexed, viz:

Beginning at the northwesterly corner of Lot 15 of the northern portion of the Montezuma Tract, as per map recorded in Book 34, page 10 of Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County, said corner being an angle point in the present northerly boundary line of the City of Los Angeles; and also being an angle point in the present southerly boundary line of the City of Eagle Rock; thence in the general southerly, northwesterly, southwesterly, westerly and northwesterly direction, following the various courses and curves of the present boundary line of the City of Los Angeles to its intersection with the easterly boundary line of the City of Tropico; thence in the general northerly, easterly and northerly directions, following the various courses of the boundary line of the City of Tropico to its intersection with the southerly boundary line of the City of Glendale; thence easterly, northerly and easterly following the various courses of the boundary line of the City of Glendale to its intersection with the westerly boundary line of the City of Eagle Rock; thence in the general southerly, easterly and southerly directions, following the various courses of the boundary line of the City of Eagle Rock to the point of beginning.

WESTGATE ANNEXATION

By an election held in the proposed territory on April 24, 1916, and an election within the City of Los Angeles, June 6, 1916, a record of the same being filed with the Secretary of State, June 14, 1916, following described territory, known as "Westgate," was annexed:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the northerly boundary line of that certain territory annexed to the City of Los Angeles May 22, 1915, commonly known as and called "Palms," with the southeasterly boundary line of the City of Sawtelle; thence northeasterly along the southeasterly boundary line of said City of Sawtelle to the most easterly corner of said city; thence northwesterly along the northeasterly boundary line of said City of Sawtelle to the

most northerly corner of said city lying in the northeasterly line of that certain street or road known as and called Military Avenue, said corner being also a point in the southwesterly line of Block 13, Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres, as per map recorded in Book 52, pages 9 to 12, both inclusive, Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County; thence northwesterly in a direct line to the most southerly corner of Lot 3, said Block 13; thence northeasterly in a direct line to the most easterly corner of Lot 10, said Block 13; thence northwesterly in a direct line to the most easterly corner of Lot 14, Block 22, said Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres; thence northeasterly in a direct line to the most easterly corner of Lot 1, Block 23, said Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres; thence northwesterly in a direct line to the most northerly corner of Lot 4, said Block 23; thence southwesterly in a direct line to the most easterly corner of Lot 18, Block 22, said Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres; thence northwesterly along the northeasterly line of Lots 18 and 19, said Block 22, to the most northerly corner of said Lot 19; thence southwesterly in a direct line to the most westerly corner of Lot 6, said Block 22; thence southeasterly along the southwesterly line of said Block 22 to the point of intersection with the northeasterly prolongation of the southeasterly line of that portion of Block 230 of "that portion of the Rancho San Vicente y Santa Monica, known as the Villa Farms, as vacated and being reverted to acreage by order of the Board of Supervisors, excepting Blocks 199, 200, 201, and Lots 12 and 16 of Block 203", as per map recorded in Book 70, pages 54, 55 and 56, Miscellaneous Records of said county, lying northerly of the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers; thence southwesterly along said prolongation and along the southeasterly line of said portion of said Block 230 to the most easterly corner of the first parcel of land described in that certain deed, conveying certain lands to the National Home for Disabled Volunteer Soldiers, recorded in Book 1368, pages 163 to 167, both inclusive, of Deeds, Records of said county; thence in the general northwesterly direction following the various courses of the northeasterly line of said parcel of land to the most northerly corner thereof; thence southwesterly along the northwesterly line of said parcel of land to the most westerly corner thereof; thence in the general southeasterly direction following the various courses of the southwesterly line of said parcel of land to the most southerly corner thereof; thence southeasterly in a direct line to the most northerly corner of Artesian Tract, as per map, recorded in Book 4, page 90 of Maps, Records of said county, said corner being also an angle point in the northerly boundary line of the City of Sawtelle; thence southwesterly along the northwesterly boundary line of said City of Sawtelle to the most westerly corner thereof, said corner being also a point in the northeasterly boundary line of the City of Santa Monica; thence northwesterly, southwesterly, northwesterly and southwesterly, following the various courses of the northeasterly and northwesterly boundary line of said City of Santa Monica to a point in said boundary line due east of the most southerly corner of Allotment No. 1 as Pascual Marquez, as shown on Map of the Partition of Rancho Boca de Santa Monica, filed in Case No. 2405 of the Superior Court of Los Angeles County; thence due west to the most southerly corner of said Allotment No. 1; thence northwesterly in a direct line to the most easterly corner of Lot A, Tract No. 1719, as per map recorded in Book 21, pages 162 and 163 of

Maps, Records of said county; thence northwesterly along the north-
 easterly line of said Lot A, and along the northwesterly prolonga-
 tion thereof to the point of intersection with the easterly prolonga-
 tion of the northerly line of Tract No. 1496, as per map recorded in
 Book 23, page 4 of Maps, Records of said county; thence westerly
 along said last mentioned prolongation and along the northerly line
 of said Tract No. 1496 to the most westerly corner of said Tract
 No. 1496, said corner being also the most northerly corner of Lot B,
 Tract No. 1719 hereinbefore mentioned; thence southwesterly and
 northwesterly along the northwesterly and northeasterly lines of
 said Tract No. 1719, to the most northerly corner of Lot 230, said
 Tract No. 1719; thence in the general southwesterly, southeasterly
 and southwesterly directions, following the various courses of the
 northwesterly, southwesterly and northwesterly boundary lines of
 said Tract No. 1719 to the most westerly corner of Lot 163, said
 Tract No. 1719; thence southwesterly in a direct line to the most
 westerly corner of Allotment No. 2 to Pascual Marquez, as shown on
 the hereinbefore mentioned Map of the Partition of Rancho Boca de
 Santa Monica; thence south 45 degrees 15 minutes west (true course)
 to a point in the southerly boundary line of the County of Los
 Angeles; thence westerly along the southerly boundary line of the
 County of Los Angeles to a point due south of the southwesterly cor-
 ner of Allotment No. 3 to Pascual Marquez, as shown on the herein-
 before mentioned map of the Partition of Rancho Boca de Santa Monica;
 thence due north to the southwesterly corner of said Allotment No. 3;
 thence northwesterly and northerly, along the southwesterly and west-
 erly lines of said Allotment No. 3 to the northwesterly corner there-
 of; said corner being also a point in the northerly line of Rancho
 Boca de Santa Monica, as per map recorded in Book 3, pages 12 and 13
 of Patents, Records of said county; thence westerly along the north-
 erly line of said rancho to the northwesterly corner thereof said
 corner being also the most westerly corner of Rancho San Vicente y Sant
 Monica, as per map recorded in Book 3, pages 30 and 31 of Patents,
 Records of said county; thence northeasterly along the northwesterly
 line of said Rancho San Vicente y Santa Monica to the northwesterly
 corner thereof, said corner being also a point in the southerly bounda-
 ry line of that certain territory annexed to the City of Los Angeles,
 May 22, 1915, commonly known as and called the San Fernando Valley
 Annexation District; thence easterly following the various courses
 of the southerly boundary line of said San Fernando Valley Annexa-
 tion District to a point distant thereon 2255.34 feet westerly from
 the northeasterly corner of Rancho San Vicente y Santa Monica, here-
 inbefore mentioned; thence due south to a point in the northwesterly
 line of Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres, as per map recorded in
 Book 3, page 296 of Patents, Records of said county; thence north-
 easterly along the northwesterly line of said Rancho San Jose de
 Buenos Ayres to the most northerly corner of said rancho; thence
 southeasterly along the northeasterly line of said Rancho San Jose
 de Buenos Ayres to its intersection with the southerly line of Sec-
 tion 10, Township 1 South, Range 15 West, San Bernardino Base and
 Meridian; thence easterly along section lines to a point in the
 northerly prolongation of the westerly line of Lot 3, Section 14,
 said Township and Range, said point being also an angle point in
 the westerly boundary line of the City of Beverly Hills; thence in
 the general southerly, easterly, southerly, southeasterly, north-

westerly, westerly and southeasterly directions following the various courses of the boundary line of the City of Beverly Hills to the southwesterly corner of said city; said corner being also a point in the northeasterly line of Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres hereinbefore mentioned; thence southeasterly along the northeasterly line of said Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres, to its intersection with the northeasterly prolongation of a line drawn parallel with and distant 210 feet northwesterly, measured at right angles from the southeasterly line of said Rancho San Jose de Buenos Ayres; thence southwesterly along said prolongations and along said parallel line to its intersection with the northwesterly prolongation of the southwesterly line of First Street, as shown on the map of the Palms, recorded in Book 13, pages 1 to 4, both inclusive, of Miscellaneous Records of said county; thence southeasterly along said prolongation to a point in the boundary line of Ballona Rancho, as per map recorded in Book 1, pages 309, and 310 of Patents, Records of said county; said point being an angle point in the boundary line of that certain territory annexed to the City of Los Angeles, May 22, 1915, commonly known as and called "Palms"; thence in the general southeasterly and westerly direction, following the various courses and curves of the boundary line of said annexed territory to the point of beginning.

OWENSMOUTH ANNEXATION

By an election held in the proposed territory on February 5, 1916, and an election within the City of Los Angeles on February 20, 1917, a record of same being filed with the Secretary of State, February 26, 1917, the following described territory, known as "Owensmouth," was annexed:

Beginning at the southeast corner of Lot 4, Block 2, of Owensmouth, Sheet No. 1, recorded in Book 19, page 36 of Maps, Records of Los Angeles County; thence east in a direct line to the southwest corner of Lot 4, Block 10, of said Owensmouth; thence south in a direct line to the northwest corner of Lot 1, Block 113 of Owensmouth, Sheet No. 2, recorded in Book 19, page 37 of Maps, Records of Los Angeles County; thence west in a direct line to the northeast corner of Lot 1, Block 124 of said Owensmouth, Sheet No. 2; thence north in a direct line to the point of beginning.

WEST COAST ANNEXATION

By an election held in the proposed territory on April 6, 1917, and an election within the City of Los Angeles, June 5, 1917, a record of same being filed with the Secretary of State, June 15, 1917, the following described territory, known as "West Coast", was annexed, viz:

Beginning at a point in the westerly boundary line of that certain territory annexed to the City of Los Angeles, December 26, 1906, said point being also the northeasterly corner of Lot 660, Tract No. 668, as per map recorded in Book 15, pages 194 and 195 of Maps, Records of Los Angeles County; thence westerly in a
