## Breeders and Members of Organization Will Pay Visit to Stock Farm

Jersey cattle breeders and members of the California Jersey Cattle club will arrive in Los Angeles tomorrow from all parts of California for the annual Jersey jubilee, which will consist of a two-day program in and around this city. According to Ferdinand R. Bain, president of the organization, this will be one of the important events of the association's history.

The two-day program will start promptly at 10 o'clock tomorrow morning at La Lomita rancho, a Jersey stock farm owned by President Bain. The breeders and lovers of Jerseys will assemble here, and during the morning session will make an inspection and tour of La Lomita rancho and its 149 blooded animals. At noon the 100 breeders and guests will participate in a barbecue served on the rancho.

### SERIES OF TALKS

The afternoon session will consist of a series of talks by prominent Jersey breeders of the state on such subjects as "Type and Production," "Selecting the Herd Sire" and "A Trade-mark for Our Jersey Milk." Among the speakers will be Samuel H. Green, secretary of the California dairy council, who will discuss the "Tuberculin Law"; F. R. Bain, Harry H. Cook, secretary of the California Jersey Cattle club, and others. There will be serious discussion between the speeches, in which many of the breeders will participate.

The evening program will be featured by a banquet held at the Biltmore hotel at 8 o'clock, and the annual election of officers. President Bain estimates that approxi-

mately 75 breeders and guests will be present at this event.

### TOUR OF JERSEY FARMS

The Thursday program will consist of a Jersey jubilee tour of the leading Jersey farms of Southern California. The cattle breeders will leave Los Angeles at 8 o'clock for El Monte, where an inspection of the famous Eastmont Jersey farm, owned by Grant A. Brown, will be made. The next step will take the Jersey men to Chino, the home of the San Alois Jersey farms, owned by Secretary Harry H. Cook. Here the visitors will see what register of merit testing has done, resulting in gold and silver medal cows. There will also be a demonstration of the improvement over dam by prepotent sire.

At noon a lunch will be served at J. E. Wherrell's Jersey farm at Riverside. Here will be shown the results of proper herd management, followed by a talk by a representative of the American Jersey Cattle club.

### VISIT OTHER FARMS

Frank Van Derpeet's Jersey farm at Arlington will next be inspected by the breeders and following this a tour of the Golden Glenn stock farm of George A. Thomas in the same district will be made. The last inspection will be made at D. Eymann Huff's Jersey farm at Orange, where a well known herd of Jerseys will be studied by the expert Jersey men. This will conclude the two-day program and the visitors will return to Los Angeles late Thursday afternoon.

Among the prominent Southern California breeders who will participate in the two-day Jersey jubilee are F. R. Bain, president; Harry H. Cook, secretary; Samuel H. Green, secretary California dairy council; J. E. Wherrell, Riverside; Frank Van Derpeet, Arlington; George A. Thomas, Arlington; D. Eymann Huff, Orange; Grant A. Brown, El Monte; Professor Reagan, University of

California stock farms at Davis; Professor Hayward and wife, Polytechnic high school, San Luis Obispo, and many others.

### GETS CIVIC CENTER SITE
