It will be in the middle of October, at least, before the dubhouse, and entire plant will be opened, Abbott stated. Construction is going at top speed, but, due to the many facilities other than those for tennis, that are being built, it will take some time to finlah it.

The membership list has grown during the past week from 300 to more than 400. Applications for entrance are being filed faster than the committee can handle. Palomar officials have applied to the Southern California Tennis Assoclation for a permit to stage a tournament this fall.
