Accarding to W. F. Buck, Jr., president of the Falomar, the clubhouse, exhibition court and grandstand with a seating capacity of \$500, will be completed in time for the tournament, which is to be held Easter Sunday.

The main grounds of the club

occupy an entire block of land which lends itself, by its natural contour and location, to the development of a tennis club second to none. The clubleouse, exhibition courts and swimming pool will occupy an entire block of, frontage on Motor avenue, in Cheviot Hills, sloping sently away from the building. The romaining space will be laid out into sisteen tennis courts of full regulation size, 60x120 feet, in two tiers, slight on each side of a central walk. The design of the clubhouse is true spanish, very low and long. Old Spanish tile will complete the atmosphere.
