

PALOMAR TENNIS CLUB STARTED

Snodgrass Breaks Ground With Racket



Starting Work on New \$100,000 Project

Harvey Snodgrass, former national ranking tennis player, now a professional, turned the first racketful of dirt yesterday, assisted by Mrs. Hazel Benedict, wife of the club's vice-president.

USING a tennis racket for the conventional spade, Harvey Snodgrass, former national ranking tennis player, now a professional, broke ground yesterday afternoon for the new \$100,000 Palomar Tennis clubhouse and swimming pool at Cheviot Hills near the California Country Club.

According to W. F. Buck, Jr., president of the Palomar, the clubhouse, exhibition court and grandstand with a seating capacity of 3500, will be completed in time for the tournament, which is to be held Easter Sunday.

The main grounds of the club

occupy an entire block of land which lends itself, by its natural contour and location, to the development of a tennis club second to none. The clubhouse, exhibition courts and swimming pool will occupy an entire block of frontage on Motor avenue, in Cheviot Hills, sloping gently away from the building. The remaining space will be laid out into sixteen tennis courts of full regulation size, 60x120 feet, in two tiers, eight on each side of a central walk. The design of the clubhouse is true Spanish, very low and long. Old Spanish tile will complete the atmosphere.
