

Preuss Road Name Change Wins Approval

Isidore B. Dockweiler and a number of property owners were successful yesterday afternoon at the City Hall in their appeal to the City Planning Committee to recommend the adoption of the ordinance changing the name of Preuss Road to Robertson Boulevard. This street north and south is between Sherman and Culver City, and is known also in other sections of the artery as Arnaz street, as Seward street and as Sherman avenue.

It is said that if the city changes the name of the city section to Robertson Boulevard the Supervisors will change the county sections to Robertson Boulevard. The name is given in honor of G. D. Robertson who, Mr. Dockweiler said, had done much for the development of this section of the city.

Mr. Dockweiler said that a proposal to name the through street Culver Boulevard did not have the support of Harry Culver.

PAVING ECONOMY URGED

The Board of City Planning Commissioners yesterday asked the City Council that new streets in the outlying districts be dedicated to the ultimate width desired, but that paving and other improvements be installed on a scale in keeping with present needs. By this method, the commission said, agricultural property will be relieved of burdensome street assessments.
