WHIPPET RACE AT PALOMAR

Fast Dogs Slated to Run at Tennis Club on April 10

The first official race of the season of the Whilppet Association of Callfornia will be held Sunday afternoon, April 10, on a course now being laid out at Cheviot Hills near the Palomar Tennis Club. Sixteen of the fastest dogs in the United States will compete for a large purse put up by Frans Nelson.

This race will be the first real test of the year for the whippets. All of them will have been in intensive training for three weeks preceding the Cheviot Hills race, and they will henceforth be kept in condition by their owners for the following races. This year promises to be the biggest whippet racing season since the exciting sport became popular in the United States.

Southern California has been a whippet center since the dog racing was introduced into this country from England some years ago. Florida is the center of the sport in winter, and many of the fastest castern dogs are rapidly being shipped to the Coast, some of which will race at Cheviot Hills.

There will be no admission charge to the races on April 10.
