

HARBOR TRADE INDEX CLIMBS

Runs 24 Per Cent Over February, 1938, Level

Exports through Los Angeles-Long Beach Harbor registered a 24 per cent gain last month over February, 1938, Clarence H. Matson, manager of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce harbor, foreign commerce and shipping committee, reported yesterday.

February's 384,029 tons had a value of \$9,609,983, as compared to 342,237 tons, totaling \$7,750,612 in February, 1938.

Oil shipments increased more than 500,000 barrels.

Lumber receipts made strong advances, February's 68,413,000 board feet exceeding the figure for the similar month in 1938 by more than 20,000,000 and January's total by more than 12,000,000.
