

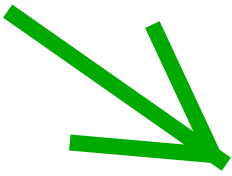
Red Cross to Hire 300 Here as Field Aides

Open to high school graduates, a new salaried Red Cross position—field assistants—with successful applicants being assigned to duty in continental United States was announced yesterday by Edward Schottland of San Francisco, Pacific area personnel department representative, at recruitment headquarters, 2030 Wilshire Blvd.

Three hundred men and women are being sought for this position from Los Angeles and vicinity with 60 of these assured of assignment somewhere in Southern California, Schottland said.

In addition to high school graduation, it is desirable that applicants, between 25 and 45, have college, business or secretarial school training.

Rosslyn Hotel Purchased by Detroit Man

The 1100-room Rosslyn Hotel and Annex at Fifth and Main Sts., which figured in a real estate transaction several months ago, has been acquired from its new owners, William E. Tooley and Robert S. McKee, to be added to the hotel holdings of Sanford D. Adler, Detroit, it was announced yesterday.

Acquiring the hotel under an option to purchase for \$1,500,000, Adler said that many improvements in facilities will be effected as soon as material shortages ease. The hotel was built in 1914, and the annex was added 10 years later.
