Virginia Hill Quizzed in East

NEW YORK, Aug. 8. (U.P.)—Virginia Hill, troubled girl friend of slain gangster Benjamin (Bugsie) Siegel, stepped off a Trans-World airliner from Paris tonight and was questioned immediately by a special investigator for the Los Angeles District Attorney.

The round-faced brunette, who Los Angeles authorities said was marked for death by the same gunmen who killed "my Ben," smiled at photographers and newsmen as she walked to customs office with Investigator Thomas Slack. Later she flew to Miami.

Virginia's plane landed here shortly after 7 p.m. after a brief stop at Boston. She refused to talk with reporters but seemed far calmer here than at Boston, Shannon and Paris, where she alternately wept, berated and tried to cripple newsmen.

'Fed Up' With Role

In Boston guards hurried her to the Department of Health Building and from that sanctuary she sent out word that she was "fed up with being a headline heroine" and was completely through with that role.

"I'll never speak to newsmen again," Passenger Agent Bertha Hatzian quoted her. "I'll never grant another interview or talk with anyone from the press. They've been making up stories about me for eight weeks. Even if they cut my tongue out I won't talk to them."

Game Devices Hold Hotelman

SAN DIEGO, Aug. 8. (AP)—Sanford Dennis Adler, 37, whose hotel interests in Southern California and Nevada include the Flamingo of the late Bugsie Siegel fame at Las Vegas, was booked on a charge of possession of gambling equipment here tonight after a Sheriff's raid on the Hotel Del Mar garage.

Sheriff Bert Strand said Adler, whose Adler Enterprises recently reported acquiring the Flamingo from those who had been associated in it with Siegel, was booked on a misdemeanor charge of violating a county ordinance prohibiting possession of gaming equipment and was released on \$250 bail.

Sheriff Strand termed the raid a "prevention move." No one was operating the games.
