

Tennis Club Suit Target

CULVER CITY — Owners of 13 Culver City homes have filed suit in Superior Court against a nearby tennis club, charging it made too much noise, and have asked an injunction to prevent further club operation until it had "toned down" its facilities.

The suit was filed against the owners and managers of the Standard Club, formerly the California Racquet Club, at 3077 Motor Ave. Named defendants included actor Jack Lemmon, movie producer Richard A. Quine and lawyer Robert A. Eaton, owners; actress Edie Adams, former owner, and Jack Broder and his wife, Beatrice, managers.

The 12 couples and one man who filed the suit asked \$15,000 damages each. They demanded "modulation" of music, loudspeakers, tennis and swimming events and asked for more complete parking facilities.
