

Cal-Neva Sold To Las Vegas Hotel Operator

Cal-Neva lodge at Lake Tahoe has been sold to Sanford Adler of the Flamingo hotel in Las Vegas.

The sale was announced by Adler's publicity man, Edward Scofield, in Los Angeles, and confirmed by the present owner, Elmer (Bones) Remmer, in San Francisco.

The two announcements didn't agree on the price being paid for the lavish establishment, however.

Scofield said the price tag was \$700,000, but Remmer said it was \$800,000.

Associated in the purchase with Adler is Charles Resnick of Las Vegas, who is also associated in the operation of the Flamingo and the El Rancho Vegas.

Scofield announced Resnick would handle Cal-Neva with Tom Miles, now on the Flamingo staff, as resident manager. It will be operated under the firm name of Cal-Neva lodge, inc.

Scofield said the resort will open June 18.

Part of the sale price reportedly will go to pay off a \$375,000 mortgage held by Bill Graham and James McKay, operators of Reno's Bank club.

Remmer has not applied for a Nevada gambling permit this year, but the new owners are expected to do so shortly.

He said only a small down payment has been made on the lodge but that he expects the purchasers' efforts to finance the balance will be successful and the deal completed late this month.

Remmer recently lost a court battle to prevent police from closing his Menlo club in San Francisco. The place had operated as a social card club for members only but police said illegal gambling was conducted.
