

GAMING RAID JURY TRIALS REQUESTED

*Fourteen Trapped by Vice
Squad Enter Not Guilty
Pleas to Charges*

Fourteen persons arrested on various charges of gambling when Acting Captain of Detectives Sears, and his newly depleted Central vice squad raided the Palomar-Pacific Club at 3084 Motor avenue on the 5th inst., pleaded not guilty yesterday afternoon before Municipal Judge Pope and asked for jury trials. The cases were transferred to Division 7, for 9:30 a.m. August 4.

The raid of the Palomar-Pacific Club is the first of a series contemplated by Sears and his squad in an effort to close up many such clubs reported by the vice squad captain to be operating throughout the city, especially in the downtown and Hollywood sections.

"In these places you can get the finest imported liquors in all kinds of fancy pre-prohibition drinks," said Sears. "While we have no local liquor laws which we can enforce, we intend to close up such places as public nuisances."
