

## Second Man Faces Charge in Del Mar Hotel Gambling Raid

SAN DIEGO, Aug. 11 (AP) — Henry Paronelli of Los Angeles, who on Saturday through an attorney made demand upon Sheriff Bert Strand for \$5,000 worth of gambling equipment seized by sheriff's deputies in the Hotel Del Mar garage Friday, was charged in a complaint today as owner of the equipment. He has not been arrested.

The property was described by the sheriff as illegal under provisions of a county ordinance. The charge is a misdemeanor.

A similar charge is pending against Sanford Dennis Alder, 37, owner of the Hotel Del Mar. Adler, who recently bought the late Benjamin (Bugsy) Siegel's Flamingo club in Las Vegas, Nev., has denied that he owned the equipment and said that the garage in which the machines were found had been leased to Paronelli. Adler is at liberty on \$250 bail.
