

Edward Hurst's Body En Route From Mexico

Private funeral services for Edward R. Hurst, 63, Los Angeles realty operator, will be conducted at Forest Lawn Memorial Park later this week after the arrival of Mr. Hurst's body from Mexico City, where he died at the English Hospital last Sunday. Only members of the immediate family will be present and flowers will be omitted.

Mr. Hurst, who left for Mexico City Oct. 28 with Mrs. Hurst after having retired Oct. 1 from the realty firm of Neff & Hurst, was stricken at a Mexico City golf club where he had played the previous day. Mrs. Hurst returned here by plane yesterday.

In Southland 23 Years

Born April 27, 1880, in Haldimand County, Ont., Mr. Hurst managed hotel and apartment properties in Toronto and St. Catherine's, Ont., until he came here 23 years ago. He became associated 14 years ago with Harold G. Neff, with whom he developed the Chevlot Hills residential section, of which he was an early resident.

For several years he served as a director of the Los Angeles Realty Board. He was an early member, past president and an honorary life member of the California Country Club, past president of the Southern California Golf and Southern California Senior Golf associations and a director of the California Golf Association.

He leaves his widow, Mrs. Nora Hurst, 10327 Chevlot Drive; two brothers, Alexander, Canoga Park, and Burton, Selkirk, Ont.; and six sisters, Mrs. Edward F. Reicheld, Reseda; Mrs. Ernest Buckley and Mrs. William Edwards, Hagersville, Ont.; Mrs. Norman Buckley, Selkirk; Mrs. Katie Nauman, Cayuga, Ont., and Mrs. Louis Young, also of Ontario Province.
