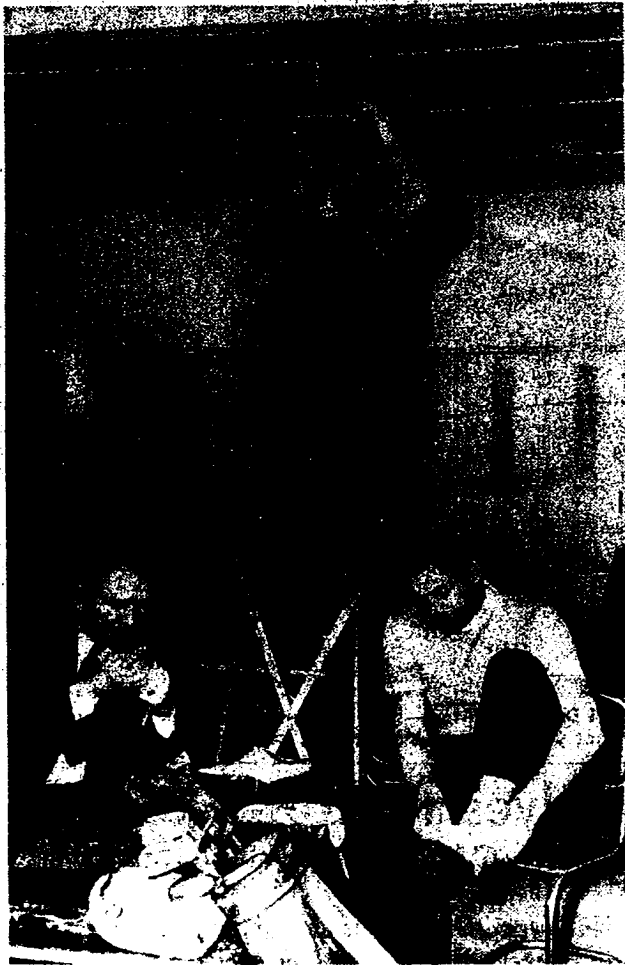
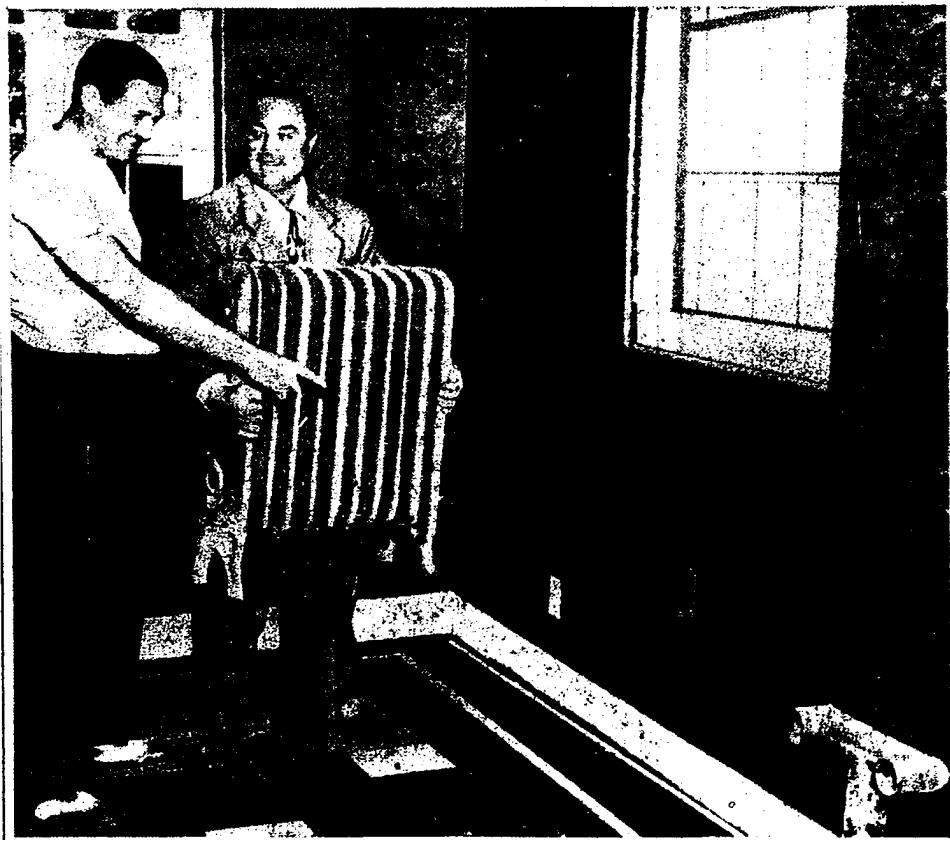


THEY'RE GOLFING AT ROLLING HILLS TODAY

Rolling Hills Country Club Opens Today

Rolling Hills Country Club today officially opens its doors and fairways as the newest private club in the Southland.

The name, of course, isn't familiar yet to local golfers. But you'll certainly recognize it by two former names, Cheviot Hills and California C.C.

Located in the heart of Cheviot Hills, the club opens under the ownership of John Montague, golf's erstwhile "mystery man," and his partner Sheppard (Shep) Kelley, local sportsman.

Alterations Made

If you're familiar with the old clubhouse, you won't recognize it now. Alterations and remodeling have been done throughout. A steam room and barbershop have been built in and the place generally overhauled with complete facilities of a luxury club. The course is in fine condition.

Membership is being strictly limited to the higher brackets with a heavy sprinkling of film, radio and war executive names. The links layout is only a few minutes from several studios and war plants.

Feel at Home

"Our idea is to give the membership the club," Montague said last night. "We've fixed it up to make everyone right at home."

Cheviot Hills, a public club, folded last June because of financial difficulties, same reason the California Club went out of business after years of prosperity as one of the better Southland private clubs.

Montague and Kelley took over the links a few months ago and, with material they already had on hand in storage, started remodeling the club.

A press preview will be held at the club Tuesday.
