

RAINEY, Marjorie Hamlin
passed away on December 18, 1992. Beloved wife of the late Garnet Rainey and loving daughter of the late Clare and Ralph Hamlin, she was born in Los Angeles on May 16, 1905. She graduated from Marlborough School, attended Ecole Francaise in New York City. She served the Los Angeles community as a member of the Superior Court Jurtes in 1941; the Los Angeles Grand Jury in 1947, and the Los Angeles Federal Grand Jury in 1979, and served on the Executive Board of the Council of Social Agencies. In 1942 to 1943 she was President of the Los Angeles Junior League, and during World War II was the first Chairman of the Los Angeles Red Cross Nurses Aide. She was a founding member of the Visiting Nurse Association, the Nine O'Clock Players of the Assistance League, and the Hollywood Bowl Association. She was twice a member of the Marlborough Alumni Association Board; a member of the Costume Council of the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, and the Salon Francaise as well as a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Colonial Dames of America, and the Magna Charta Dames.

She is survived only by cousins.
